SHOULD WE ADD A PERMANENT STAGE TO CARYFORD HALL?

WE THINK WE SHOULD

- To bring other activities/events to Cary and Ansford (such as pantomime, theatre, music, concerts, choir and fashion shows). The dressing rooms, will also provide additional space for letting out and will enable us to accommodate the bookings we currently turn away because the Hall is fully booked.

WHY NOW?

- A stage was considered when the Hall was built but, for various reasons, the additional cost could not be justified at that time. The committee has recently been approached by local organisations to investigate the possibility of a stage at Caryford Hall, as there is no other suitably equipped facility available in Castle Cary or Ansford. This has made us look at the possibility of a stage again.
- The population of Cary and Ansford is growing. As a community resource, we need to be able to meet the increased need.

THE BENEFITS OF ADDING A STAGE

- A dedicated, purpose-built stage and dressing rooms will enable us to be a venue for a range of further activities as well as providing an additional facility for existing users. With our large car park we can accommodate the greater activity.

HOW FAR DOWN THE ROAD ARE WE?

- We have formed a Steering Group and have visited a number of village halls with stages, as well as some theatres, to learn from the successes and failures of each in terms of stage design. We are now at the point of consolidating the brief for the architect.
